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### Dear Colleague,

In the 21<sup>th</sup> century, patients and providers have to navigate through an increasingly complex health care system and often face error-prone processes. It is estimated, that up to 18% of the patient safety errors in general and as many as 70% of adverse drug events could be eliminated if the right information about the right patient is available at the right time. Data linkage and health information exchange will facilitate the availability of patient-specific health information. Hence, through improving access to information, reducing reliance on memory, increasing vigilance, and contributing to standardization of processes, information systems might make important fundamental contributions towards creation of safe systems.
